



# 2021 and 2022 two years of on-going recovery from Covid

2020 was not a good year for our sport. 2021 was not great either, however by the year end a proper recovery was well under way as we all started to learn to live with the virus. 2022 was all about rebuilding.

We began 2021 in another national lockdown forced on us by the Delta variant, and a mass vaccination programme underway. After March 2021 we experienced a gradual process, but certainly not in a straight line, of loosening restrictions such that by March 2022 effectively all legal Covid restrictions had been lifted. For aquatic sports generally in the UK that has not meant a return to how things were before. The impact on Otter has been significant. Several of our pre-Covid venues have either closed for good or have still not yet reopened (Crystal Palace National Sports Centre and ULU). For many of our members, working patterns and how leisure activities fit within that have changed substantially.

However things are not all doom and gloom. Over the last 18 months it has been good to see new members joining on a regular basis, and many of our members, who left London in the early days of the pandemic, gradually returning and resuming their "normal" lives. We have managed to reinstate most of our regular social events and indeed in November 2022 we held the Annual Dinner after a 3 year hiatus.

Our swimmers are once again winning medals and setting new records in the pool. In June 2022 our ladies Water Polo team won the British Water Polo Championships defeating Manchester in the final an astounding success given the lack of pool time available to them.

There are also embryonic plans for several new pools within striking distance of Central London, situations that Otter is actively pursuing, but unfortunately they can only, at best, be a medium term solution for our lack of pool time.

I would like to thank everyone who has contributed to keeping the Club together in these difficult times, especially the Committee, the Swimming and Water Polo Captains, our Coaches, our pool bookers and everyone else who has a hand in the day to day running of the Club. There is still some way to go before we get fully back to "normal" but having a sound financial position and plenty of the traditional Otter spirit, I am supremely confident that all sections of the Club will return as strong as ever before too long.

## **CLUB ADMINISTRATION**

#### Chris Eden

#### FINANCIAL STATEMENTS OVERVIEW

The last two financial years have been difficult ones for the club. Since the pools started re-opening in late 2021, we invested in pool time where we could, but, with so many people either working partially or completely from home, the number of members getting back into training (and, therefore, paying subs) lagged significantly.

2022 is the first full year of operation and income from members was down around 25% from the last full year of operation (being 2019). With the effects of inflation and utility prices, pool costs have in some instances gone up by around 10% if not more, as the operators seek to pass their overheads onto clubs like ourselves. Total pool costs for 2022 are broadly static compared with 2019 but both polo sections are well short of the pool time they were enjoying in 2019.

Overall, the club has observed 2 years of fairly sizeable deficits, £8.5k in 2021 and £23.7k in 2022, and this explains why it was necessary to raise the fee levels for the first time in 4 years.

As would be expected, membership numbers dwindled from 2020 to 2021 despite new joiners, although we are seeing more new people joining up through 2022 and into 2023 which is positive.

The balance sheet, as a result, has suffered. While the current position shows a cash decline of £11k since 2021 and £15k since 2020, we also had a number of creditors as at the year-end (mainly very late invoicing by pools such as Guy's Hospital) which have further drained the club's coffers.

Donations are even more needed than ever to help rebuild our balance sheet back to pre-COVID levels. If you would like to make a donation, please do reach out.

# PRIZES & GENERAL FUND AND MEMORIAL FUND DONORS

The generosity of members, either in paying over and above their regular subscriptions or in making separate designated donations, continues to help manage the Club's annual costs as well as strengthen the capital base. In addition, a number of members kept subs going through the lockdown period, and these have been treated as donations. As such, we thank the following:

His many contributions to the club as long-standing member, water-polo player, long distance open water swimmer and Vice President and President 1990-97 are recorded there in detail. John's multiple contributions to the Club were always made with the enthusiastic participation of his wife Dorothy who predeceased him by 5 years. The contribution the two of them made to Club life and activity was remarkable and did much to sustain it.

John and Dorothy's family (son, Jonathan and daughters, Kate and Louise), have decided to mark how much Otter Swimming Club was part of their parent's life by very generously presenting the Club with a magnificent Salver in their memory, to be awarded annually at the discretion of the Club President for outstanding contribution to the life of the Club.

They have also made a notable gift to the Memorial Fund, the fund which is an important part of the Club's capital and which generates income to sustain annual activities. The salver is shown below and will be presented first at the next annual dinner.

The first presentation of the Illife Salver was presented to Michelle Senecal for her outstanding contribution to the club over many years, making a huge difference to the club often in the background, unbeknownst to the majority of the club. Congratulations and thank you, Michelle!



# **OBITUARIES**

#### **JOHN GORDON**

John Gordon, who died aged 75 last August, was a leading and versatile swimmer for Otter in the 1960s. For five years from 1964, he was a regular competitor for the club as well as making many appearances for both Britain and England on backstroke and on the individual medley.

His highlight was reaching the final of 440 yards individual medley at the Commonwealth Games in Jamaica in 1966, while he was also a member of many hugely successful Otter relay teams at the ASA Championships in this period.

This began in 1964 when swimming on backstroke, John was followed by George Hill on breaststroke and the Olympians Murray McLachlan (fly) and Tony Milton (free), the club took the National medley championship.

Otter would probably have retained the title the following year but for a curious incident. When John was preparing to swim the backstroke leg, he was told that a blood test had indicated that he was suffering from glandular fever. He withdrew from the squad and Otter lost by 1.5 seconds. It then transpired that the positive test had been wrongly attributed to him and in fact was that of a Mrs Joan Gordon.

In 1967, the club came second in the medley relay but won the freestyle relay, with the squad consisting of John, Jim Stewart, Dave Dickson, captain of the Australian team, and Tony Jarvis, the 1968 GB team captain.

John later became a significant figure in the development of Masters competitions, winning world titles, as well as coaching Spencer Club, which he founded.

### **CLUB PERFORMANCE: SWIMMING**

Most swimming competitions were not able to commence until the last half of 2021, due to Covid interruptions, this meant there were only a few opportunities to race, so even though our report covers 2 years, it's still shorter than normal!

#### **JULY - SEPTEMBER 2021**

t's always a challenge to perform so soon after the festive season, but 12 swimmers did Otter proud in the South East Regionals this year, and there were plenty of medals shared around.

Esther Worthington swam several masters' best times. It was a clean sweep for Fraser Peh, taking 3 gold medals in all 3 of his races, and for Oli Samy also going 2 for 2.

#### **SWIM ENGLAND MASTERS NATIONALS**

29-31 October 2021



We had 20 Otters representing at the Swim England Masters Nationals in Sheffield at the end of October 2021. Nationals is often the highlight and peak for most of our competing Otters and this year was no exception.

Some notable performances include Derek Parr and Roger Lloyd-Mostyn who claimed a medal in all their individual events (that was 8 events for Derek!); Carla Thornewell who was the fastest female Otter over the 100m freestyle; Catherine Demont and Sarah Jane Law for 1st and 3rd in the 100m butterfly, respectively; Chris Morgan, Nico Barber and Amy Barton for strong performances in the longer distance events; Kelvin Yew for travelling from Singapore to dominate his age group and Megan McDonagh for her Otter debut.

We also had four very successful relays. Our mixed 4x200m freestyle team (Chris Morgan, Alice Dinsdale-Young, Sarah-Jane Law and Nico Barber) won gold, alongside the men's 4x100m freestyle team. The men's 4x50m freestyle (Luis Martinez Del Polo, Paul Goudie, Peter Rae and Simon Williams) claimed silver and the men's 4x50m medley team (Paul Goudie, Luis Martinez Del Polo, Chris Morgan and Peter Rae) won bronze.

While there was some controversy, amongst some masters teams, about Loughborough University winning the Otter 150 cup, Otter finished a respectable 5th. Hopefully we can go claim it back next year!







#### **BRITISH MASTERS LONG COURSE 2022**

17-19 June 2022



Sixteen national titles were won by Otter swimmers at the British Masters Championships 2022 held in Aberdeen (17-19 June). The small but mighty team of ten Otters also collected 12 silver and five bronze medals for a total of 33 podium finishes, marking a thoroughly successful trip to the northeast coast of Scotland.

The premier event in the domestic masters swimming calendar was attended by 613 swimmers representing 179 clubs from all across the country, the state-of-the-art Aberdeen Sports Village hosted the three-day competition as it did back in 2017.

Every single Otter swimmer returned home with at least one individual medal, a particularly noteworthy feat which has not been achieved in recent years, if ever. The terrific ten are Amy Barton (25-29), Megan McDonagh (25-29), Alice Dinsdale-Young (30-34), Fraser Peh (30-34), David Adamson (35-39), Elizabeth Shaw (55-59), Derek Parr (75-79), Anthony Ray (75-79), Robert Thomas (75-79) and Peter Vider (75-79).



Making up for their numerical paucity with abundant quality, the compact Otter squad swam their way to an impressive seventh in the overall team standings. Ten club records were also rewritten over the weekend.

#### **SWIM ENGLAND MASTERS NATIONALS 2022**

28-30 October 2022



Another year in Sheffield, saw a crew of 20 Otters competing at the Swim England short-course Nationals. There were so many superb performances, across all ages, really show-casing Otters='s strength and depth.

#### **BRITISH MASTERS LONG COURSE 2023**

2-4 June 2023



Let's start with the big news! For the first time in at least 3 years, Otter has broken two British records! Huge congratulations to Roger Lloyd-Mostyn, Bob Thomas, Derek Parr and Tony Ray who broke the British Long Course records for the 4 x 100 medley and 4 x 200 freestyle relays, both in the 320+ category. This winning quartet also took gold in a further 2 relays during the weekend.

Not content with this success, there are plans in the pipeline to aim for another record (look out for this in 2024!)

Although not quite record breaking, we did also have some other excellent relays. The women's 120+ 4 x 50m freestyle relay of Amy Barton, Megan McDonagh, Alice Dinsdale-Young and Catherine Demont and the mixed 4 x 100m freestyle relay of Gina Hobson, Fraser Peh, Martin Sartorius and Amy Barton also took gold.

Other notable swims came from Liz Shaw, who won in the 200m freestyle but left the weekend with a medal of each colour. Will Roberts, competing for Otter at Nationals for the first time, took home 3 silvers and Chris Morgan broke the Otter record for his 800m freestyle in a time he could help but be pleased with!

#### THE OTTER HALF-MILE

The Otter Half-Mile was held at Henley Sailing club on the River Thames at Wargrave, near Henley on Friday 16 July. This was the first Otter event that has been held since the 150th celebration events in 2019 and it was a welcome return to Otter traditional social activities! While there were still some Covid lockdown restrictions in place, this did not have any impact on a thoroughly enjoyable evening.

The weather was glorious, with 24 in attendance although very well attended by the "mature" Otters, 15 swimmers completed the handicap swim event, being led off by David Skidmore OBE with Matt Burgham chasing the field from the back, 6 minutes and 30 seconds later

The race for the win was very close, with just 4 seconds between first and second, although it was the only female in the race, Alice Dinsdale-Young who won, with Ric Jones in second.

Many thanks to Jeff and his team at Henley Sailing club for hosting us and an extra special thanks for Dave Warren for organising. This was his last event as Hon. Handicapper after many years in the role. Thanks for all your hard work making these events happen, Dave!



The Otter Half-Mile was also held in July 2022. Again, another outstanding event with fantastic hospitality. This time Chris Daniels came away with the win in another tight and highly fought contest! Well done Chris! And huge thanks to Mike Reys, who has done a fantastic job in the role of Hon. Handicapper since Dave's retirement!





#### **VETS 50 FREE**

If you believe the banter on the Mature Otters mailing list, this has to be the most important event of the year. Martin Flash won this back in 2019 before the pandemic hit and prevented us from doing much swimming, let alone racing.

Unfortunately for Martin, he couldn't quite beat his handicap time this year (2022). Two gentlemen however managed to beat the expectations: Anthony Ray and Simon Williams! The rest of the field came very close to their handicap time and all finished within 0.6s. Well done to David Addison, Bob Thomas, Martin Flash and Chris Daniels.

Simon Williams was definitely too fast for the rest of the field and deservedly cycled home with the cup securely fastened on his back. Well done to Simon. I'm sure he realises his handicap for future events has just become slightly more challenging!



#### OTHER COMPETITIONS



After multiple cancellations, Pip Bennett, one of our swimming captains, headed to the World Aquathlon Championships at the end of October 2021 in El Anillo, Spain. The storms that were forecast certainly made their presence felt but athletes were grateful that during the race itself it remained dry. The course involved a 1 km open swim, a very steep and long run out to transition followed by a 5 km trail and road run. On his international multisport debut, Pip finished with a bronze in the men's 40-44 category. Excellent result, well done Pip!

Otters Pip Bennett, Ed Buckley and James Manning recently competed in the English Aquathlon Championships (750m swim, 5km run) in Nottinghamshire at the Sywell Aquathlon (Sunday 19 June 2022). It was a strong Otter performance as all medalled in their respective age groups with Pip taking Gold in the 40-44 age group, despite having to vault a closed gate during the run and getting a nasty wound on his arm. Ed and James took silver in their age groups, 45-49 and 25-29 respectively. The event was a good warm up for Pip and Ed before the British Aquathlon Championships in July and the Worlds in Slovakia for Pip later this year.







Rosie Galvin has been competing in long-distance open water events for the past few years. Most recently she competed in the Dock2Dock 15km, coming 2nd in her category (female, non-wetsuit). Last summer she was also part of an English Channel relay, in prep for a solo attempt (hopefully) next summer.

On Sunday 26th September, the "As Keen As Mustard" SwimRun event was held at Bewl Water, Kent. Whilst slightly overcast it was a great event for everyone involved. In his first SwimRun James Manning won his age group and took the silver overall in the 6km race.

Lei Ping had great success at the 5km Half Oceanman in Madeira, Portugal in September 2022. She came 3rd in her category.

The major issue for us coming out of the pandemic was the closure for refurbishment of Crystal Palace National Sports Centre - our training base. A huge thanks goes to our team manager Helen Bullock and parent Tony Hughes who did a lot of work finding us alternative pools and to Amanda Lyons for taking over sub treasurer duties to enable us to continue during this period. Otter women are now back to our original training base at Queen Mothers Sport Centre in Victoria and Alleyn's School, Dulwich.

#### **BRITISH CHAMPIONSHIPS - JULY 2021**

This was probably the first over 18 Swim England endorsed competition held after the pandemic restrictions were relaxed. #### BRITISH WATER POLO LEAGUE - 2021-22

This started again in September 2021 (there had been no league since March 2020). Otter's first team, captained by Katy Cutler came 2 nd in Division 1 and 4 th in the Super Fives (i.e. the top 5 teams in the UK). Otter Lutra (the second team) was, likely for the first time in the league's history, a fully u18 team. They came 1 st in Division 3 and went on to win Championship 2 gaining promotion to Division 2. It was a remarkable team performance led by Sarah Ellis-Keeler as captain with Sarah, Grace Turner and Pippa Danielson all top scorers.

#### **CHAMPIONS CUP BWPL - MAY 2022**

The Championship Cup is a tournament between the top 4 teams as determined by the Super Fives results. In this Otter claimed third place defeating Coventry 18-11. Lucy Bullock, a very promising 17 year old, lead the scoring with 5 goals.

#### **CHELTENHAM FESTIVAL OF WATER POLO - MAY 2022**

This is an invitational festival tournament for the top 4 clubs in the UK. This time around Otter won beating Manchester 12-5 in the final with massive contributions from two Otter players who had returned home from the USA where they were are university on water polo scholarships – Lily Turner, University of California Berkeley and Kathy Rogers, University of Michigan.

#### **BWPL 35/60 EVENT - JULY 2022**

British Water Polo League celebrated 60 years of men's national league water polo and 35 years of the women's competition in July 2022 at Parliament Hill Lido, Hampstead Heath. Otter were invited to field an over 40 masters team as part of the celebrations, recognising that Otter (men's) had been a founder member of the men's national league. It was great to see old names like Tracey Allen and Claudia Ferrone who had been stalwarts of their time in the Otter first team as well as our team manager Karen McDonagh and Lindsay Williams, who at 19 years a member, is the longest running Otter member still playing in BWPL!







#### **TOURNAMENTS ABROAD - SEPTEMBER 2022**

The squad went to two tournaments in September 2022 to set us up well for the 2022-23 BWPL season. Both were extremely well organised by first team goalie Laura Fitzharris. The first trip was to Barcelona and the BIWPA (Barcelona International Water Polo Academy) women's tournament.

With 7 teams from Spain, Germany, and Malta we took a squad of 15 and it was a really enjoyable bonding and learning experience. We came runners up to Sabadell, Spain.



The second trip was to the EU Nations Club Competition in Prague were we took 13 players, largely juniors this time. They played club teams including from the Czech Republic, Sweden, Hungary, Slovakia, and Austria coming 7th of 10 teams. As a young team it was a fantastic achievement.



#### **BRITISH WATER POLO LEAGUE - 2021-22**

Otter had a pretty impressive 2021-22 season led again by captain Katy Cutler. They came 2nd in division 1 with Katy, Toula Falvey, Mhairi Nurthen and Emily Campbell-Lamerton all making the top 10 scorers in the division. This was repeated in Super Fives where they again came 2nd with Sarah Synder joining the roster of top scorers. Otter Lutra, led by captain Lucy-Mai Helliwell came a very creditable 5th in both division 1 and championship 1.

# AMERICAN UNIVERSITIES - WATER POLO SCHOLARSHIPS

Three members of Otter's elite junior development programme joined previous Otters in USA on water polo and academic scholarships to help further their water polo careers, in September 2022. A huge congratulations to Sarah Ellis Keeler (UC Davis (California)), Natasha Gerhardstein (UCLA) and Mia Mutadich (Cal Tech).

#### INTERNATIONAL REPRESENTATION

During this period Otter had a number of international representatives. In September 2021, Lucy-Mai Helliwell (capt), Sarah Ellis-Keeler, Grace Turner, Sarah Mdaoukhi and Lucy Bullock all represented Great Britain at the u17 European Championships at Sibenik, Croatia. In July 2002, Lucy Bullock, Pippa Danielson with Natasha Gerhardstein as first reserve, represented Great Britain at the u19 European Championships in Nattanya, Israel with Katy Cutler as assistant coach.

Additionally Mhari Nurthen, Rebecca Mulcahy, Erin Andrew, Imogen Smith, Emily Campbell- Lamerton, Toula Falvey, Kathy Rogers, Katy Cutler, Lily Turner and Lucy Bullock were members of the England and Great Britain squad led by Nick Buller as head coach, Peggy Etiebet as assistant coach and Karen McDonagh as one of the team managers and represented England at various competitions including the EU Nations Water Polo Cup in Brno, Czech Republic in June 2022.

Roisin Cunningham Smythe represented Ireland at the EU Nations Water Polo Cup in Brno, Czech Republic in June 2022.

#### THE FUTURE

The period 2021-22 was one of highs and lows for Otter. We had fantastic headline results and brilliant country representation but due to the loss of Crystal Palace our elite junior development programme suffered and we were not able to enter any teams in the National Age Group Championships.

We are resurrecting this in 2023 and hopefully will have more to report on that front next year having entered a 2007 team in the Conference League and an u19 team in NAGs. Another area we are seeking to grow stronger in, in the future is our social polo offer for adults. We entered London League for the 2023 season and are looking to arrange more social events. However, we still one of only 3 clubs in the country with two teams in BWPL and we are consistently winning tournaments at the highest level - the players, parents and volunteers have much to be proud of.
